ANDREW TO STAND FOR DISTRICT & COUNTY COUNCIL ON 6 MAY

Andrew Prosser has been selected as Green Party candidate in Witney North & East

As Town Councillor for Witney North since 2019, Andrew has been working tirelessly on issues such as the planned **housing developments, safe walking and cycling, air quality in Bridge Street, flood prevention and river pollution**. He successfully challenged a planning application for 110 houses off Hailey Rd.

Andrew has now been selected as the Green Party candidate for the **District Council in Witney North** and for the **County Council in Witney North & East** in the elections on 6th May. Witney needs a strong green voice at all levels, to push for joined-up action on planning, transport, local jobs and services.

Andrew said, “**We are in a real battle now coming out of Covid, to build new employment opportunities and leisure facilities in the town. We need to tackle the climate and nature emergencies, so we’re healthier and more resilient than before.**”

NO TO 1400 NEW HOUSES IN NORTH WITNEY

Proposed development is on the wrong side of the town

Andrew is standing up against plans to build **1400 new houses in North Witney**, pointing out that building on the farmland between the Woodstock and Hailey Roads will contribute to **flooding** in central Witney by reducing the area which can absorb rainwater.

The proposed development will also add to **traffic and pollution** on the Woodstock and New Yatt Roads as well as Bridge Street, where the air quality is already of serious concern.

Andrew said, “**West Oxfordshire District Council has let down our community. I will challenge the 1400 houses which they supported and put into the Local plan.** This area already suffers from serious flooding as well as traffic and air pollution: these will only be made worse by siting the new development here.”
